SEED SYTSTEMS

- There are mainly two sources of planting materials: Formal and Informal Seed systems. They are both essential.
- Informal: Farmers undertake `seed` production, selection and exchange activities
- Formal: Organize and regulated system with activities such as breeding, seed production, distribution undertaken by public institutions or commercial actors.
- Agriculture productivity is a major challenge and High quality seed is critical to increasing agricultural productivity

Variety Development


- Development of germplasm with particular traits




Aggregate maize seed production in 2022, by region




Mt

- COMESA and SADC are two leading maize seed production regions
- Note: Number of countries varies: COMESA (21), SADC (16), ECOWAS (15)
- Lack of complete data for ECCA (Central Africa) & UMA (North Africa) though volumes from both regions are low.
- 7 countries are members of both COMESA and SADC
- Leading seed producing countries (Zambia, Zimbabwe) are members of both RECs

Only 4 countries from SADC region (Malawi, Tanzania, Zimbabwe, Mozambique)


Low % of women who are top managers. Highest is Rwanda (24%)


Women take up at least 1/3 of management positions in Kenya, Uganda, South Sudan, Mozambique

■ % women in management positions


■ % of companies with women as top manager


Maize and Soya bean seed import in 2022 (SADC)
