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### 01. Recommitment to the Principles and Values of the CAADP Process

- First NAIP (2014-2018) was reviewed and lessons learnt informed formulation of 2NAIP
- 2NAIP or CATSP has been validated by all stakeholders and awaits launch
- Major programmes under the 2NAIP/CATSP are already being implemented as 2NAIP is aligned to 8NDP (2022- 2026).
- 8NDP was developed
- A national technical group was trained for CAADP process with support from SADC to domesticate CAADP initiatives at country level





### 01. Recommitment to the Principles and Values of the CAADP Process con'td

- Technical working group to spearhead the reporting process was established
- Establishment of data clusters to facilitate data collection and validation
- MoA and MFL Strategic Plans developed
- Process to review the Plant Health bill and the Plant Varieties and Seed Act is being undertaken





#### 02. Enhancing Investment Finance in Agriculture

- Increased budget allocation to agriculture
- Improvement in budget releases to the sector
- Overall improvement in budget management and fiscal discipline
- National Policy on Development Cooperation under review
- Promotion of partnerships with development partners clearly stipulated under CATSP
- Strengthened dialogue with partners to discuss priorities



#### 02. Enhancing Investment Finance in Agriculture – cont'd

- Participation in local trade fairs and investment meetings
- Agriculture PPP Guidelines formulated
- Tax incentives for private investments
- Legislative and policy reviews to support private sector investment
- Provision of support infrastructure in high production areas





#### 02. Enhancing Investment Finance in Agriculture – cont'd

- Provision of Matching Grant facilities and loan facilities to farmers
- Implementation of agriculture subsidies
- Implementation of the Credit Guarantee Scheme
- Implementation of the weather index insurance
- Gender toolkit for agriculture sector developed





#### 03. Ending Hunger by 2025

- Agriculture Subsidy programme- FISP is being implemented
- Establishment of a Soil laboratory
- Development of soil maps being undertaken
- Domestic production of fertilizer two local companies are currently producing adequate fertiliser
- Process of reviewing the feed and fertiliser Act began
- Establishment of Livestock Breeding Centres
  - Establishment of Artificial insemination centres





#### 03. Ending Hunger by 2025 – cont'd

- Development of irrigation infrastructure such as dams and establishment of irrigation schemes
- Zero rating all irrigation equipment and accessories
- Development of irrigation master plan and guidelines commenced
- Increased support to fingerlings production
- Harmonization of SADC and COMESA seed systems
- Promotion and monitoring of community seed banks





#### 03. Ending Hunger by 2025 – cont'd

- Commenced process of repealing and replacing the legislation on seed quality control
- Commenced process of repealing and replacing the Plant breeder's rights Act, (Act No. 8 of 2008)
- Sensitization of farmers on new technologies
- Construction and rehabilitation of extension infrastructure including houses on going
- Development of e-extension portal under ZIAMIS done
- Farm block development underway



#### 03. Ending Hunger by 2025 – cont'd

- Promotion of Climate Smart Agriculture
- Promotion on use of improved seed varieties
- Promotion on use of improved fingerlings
- Promotion on production and utilization of forage
- Budget allocation towards school feeding programmes increased
- Budget allocation towards food for relief in disaster areas increased





#### 04. Halving Poverty through Agriculture by 2025

- Implementation of social cash transfer programme
- Implementation of livestock stocking and restocking programmes
- Introduction of community sale of crops by FRA
- Improvement in the Management of strategic food reserves
- Promotion of outgrower schemes
- Developed the Gender mainstreaming toolkit for the sector





### 05. Boosting intra-African Trade in Agricultural Commodities & Services

- Ratification of the African Continental Free Trade Area agreement (AfCFTA)
- Ratification of the COMESA Free Trade area
- Promotion of non traditional exports in agriculture and the services industry
- Development of the Strategy on Elimination of Non -Tariff Barriers to Trade





#### 06. Enhancing Resilience to Climate Variability

- Promotion of climate smart agricultural technologies especially among small scale farmers
- Promotion of climate smart agricultural and sustainable land management practices
- Improvements in the early warning national capacity
- Improved agriculture extension services delivery and awareness raising





### 07. Enhancing Mutual Accountability for Actions and Results

- Introduction of Multisectoral Cluster meetings
- Expanded number of stakeholders involved in preparation of BRR
- Developed roadmap on BRR results dissemination plan
